Global health activities advocacy efforts:

- Stressed global AMR funding at annual IDSA-led Stakeholder Forum on Antimicrobial Resistance
- Secured increased global TB funding
- Protected NIH's Fogarty International Center from elimination
- Sustained funding for global HIV, global health security
- Co-organized CROI physician and scientist letter on evidence-based U.S. global HIV response
- Raised awareness at Congressional briefing on PEPFAR & global health security
- Advocated for global health funding during IDSA Board advocacy day
- Joined survivors for World TB Day Hill Day; Honored Rep. Gene Green at Hill reception

VISION

APRIL 2018 AND BEYOND

Global health efforts key to future strategy:

- Educate policymakers before September 2018 UN High Level Meeting on TB:
 - IDSA letter to US UN Ambassador
 - Physician & researcher sign-on letter with American Thoracic Society, American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene and Treatment Action Group
- Secure continued global health security funding
- Maintain evidence-based, all-of-government approach to PEPFAR reauthorization
